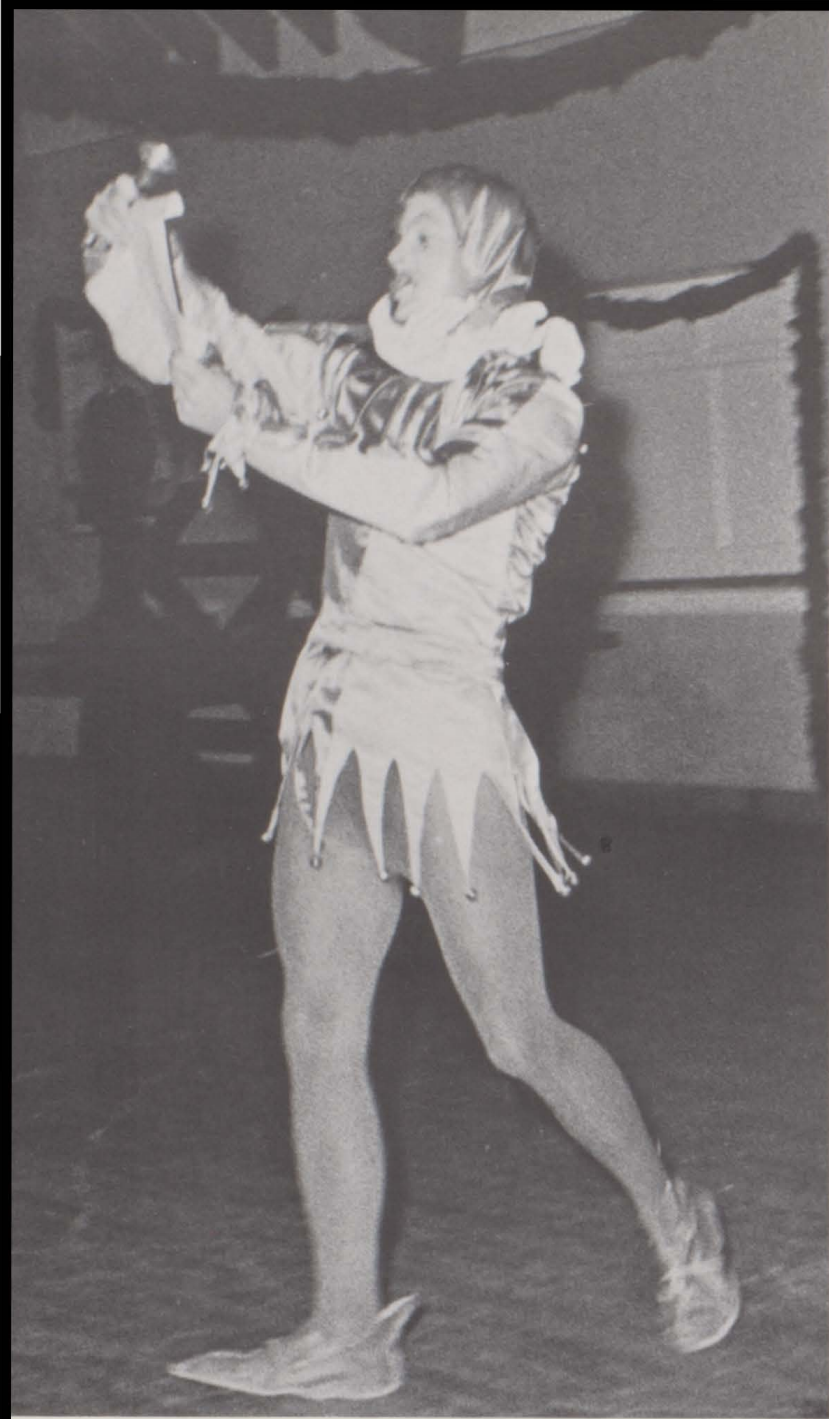

In his role as Director of Admissions, he has shown perception and intuition.



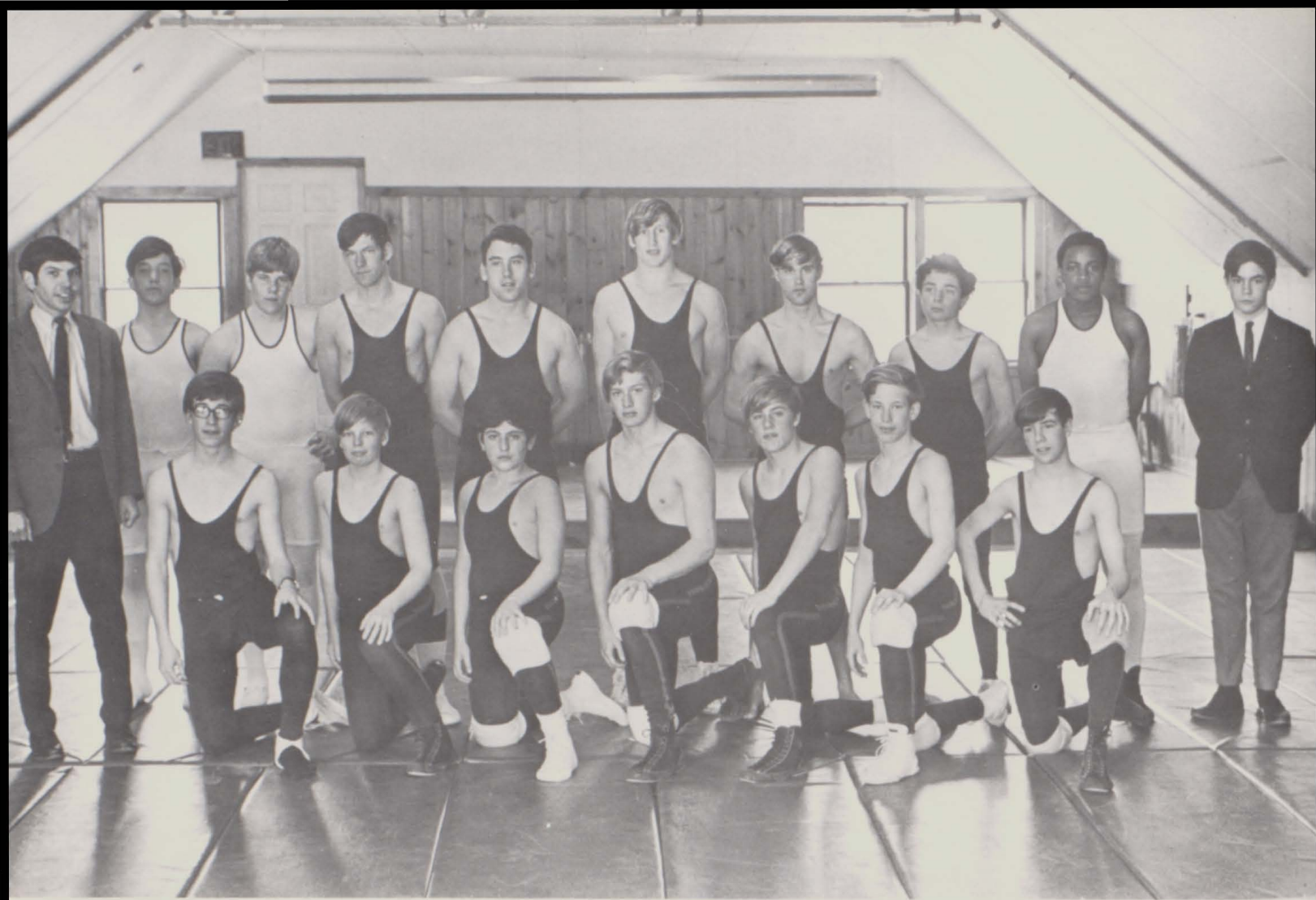
Skiing

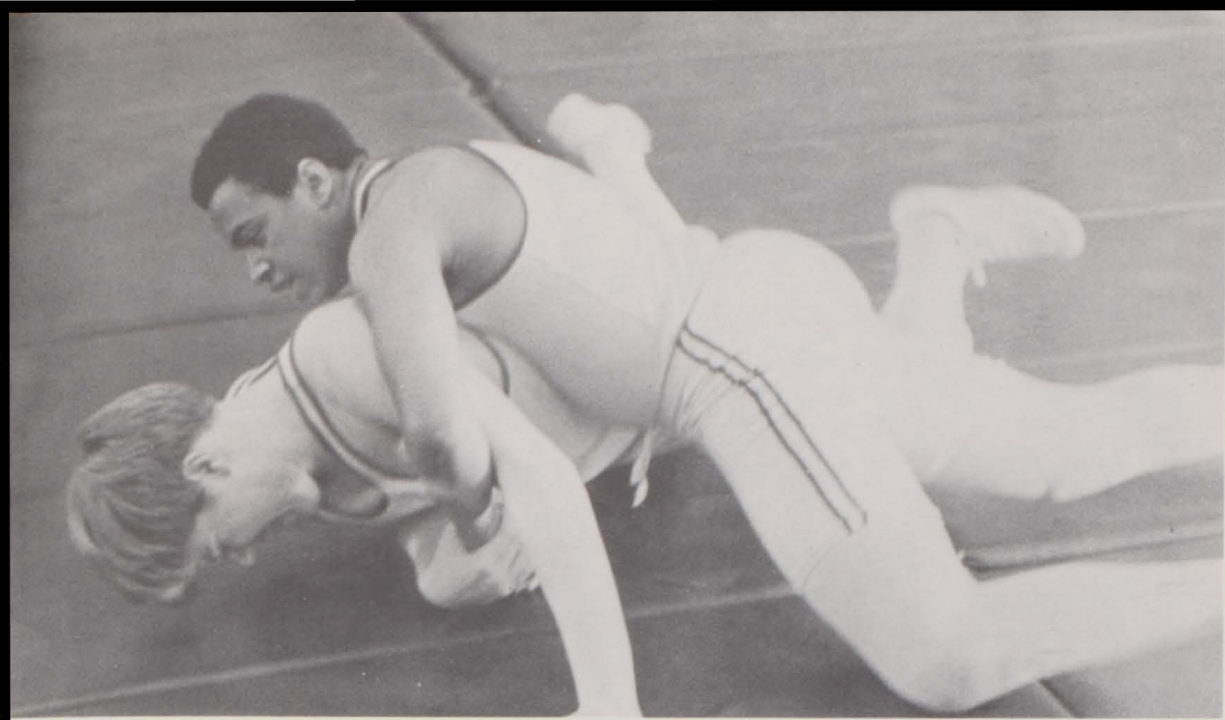

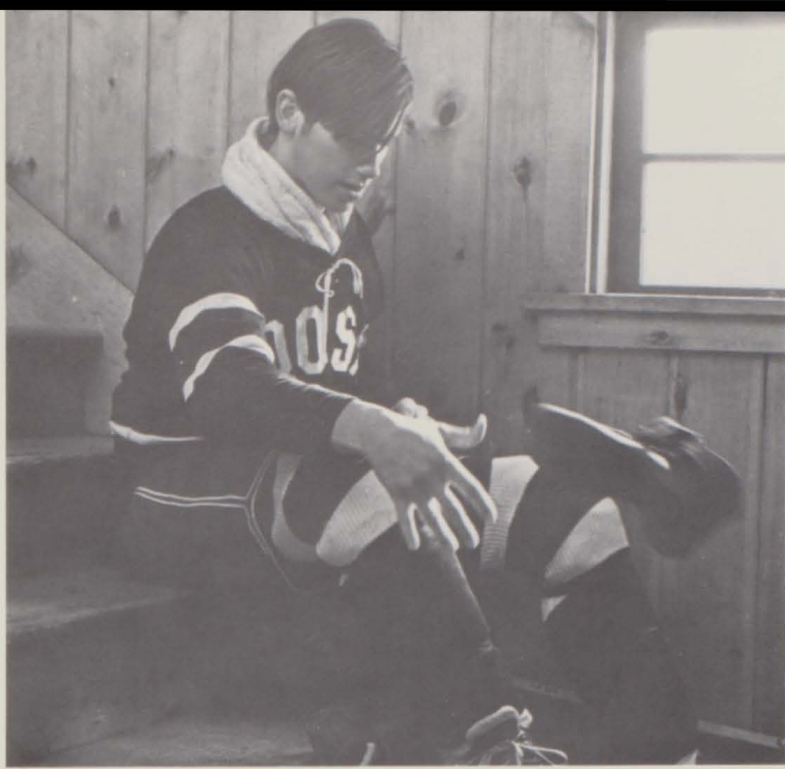

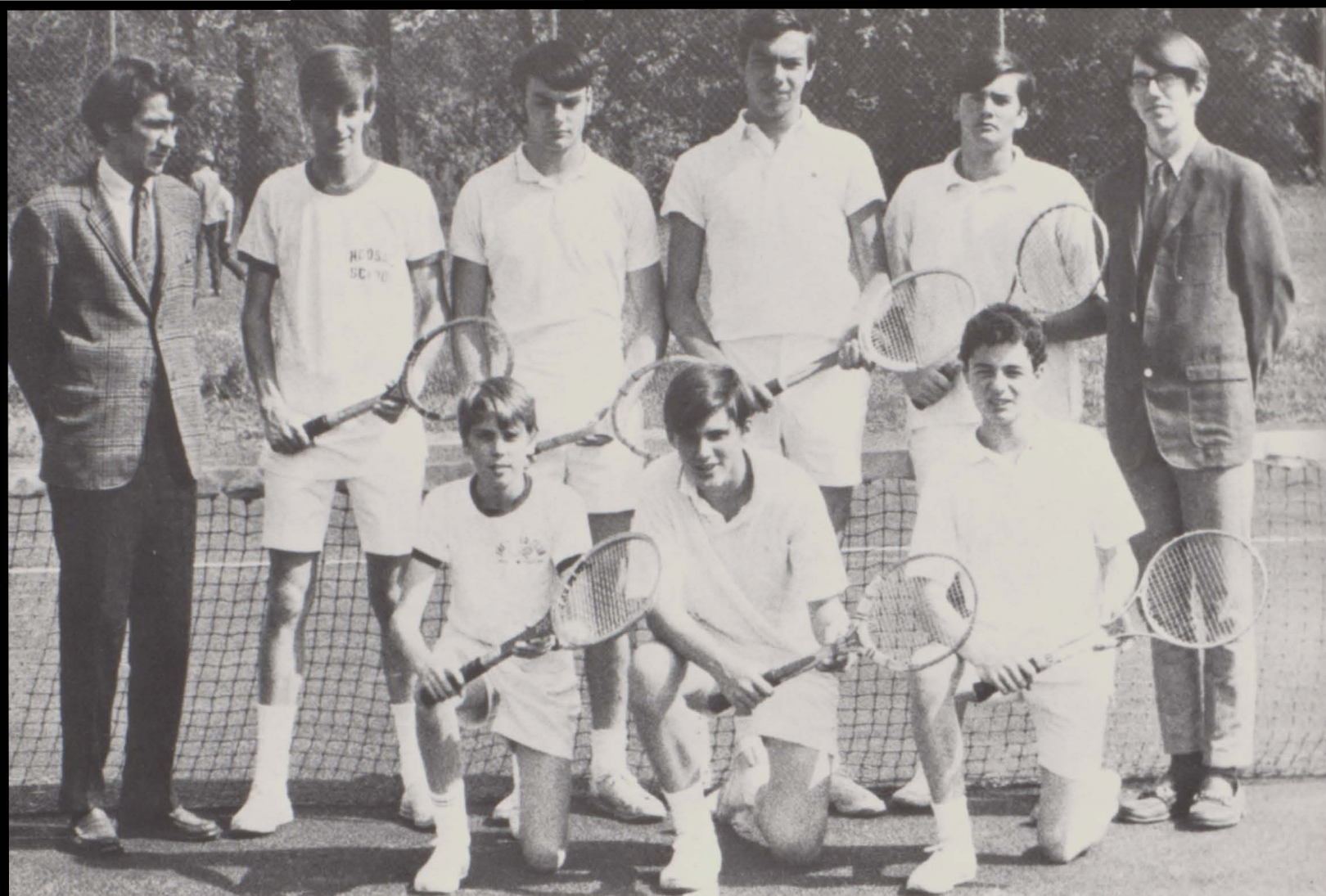
Track

New talent discovered during the season makes the outlook for next year quite good. Our appreciation goes to Mr. Balser who helped make this season a successful one.



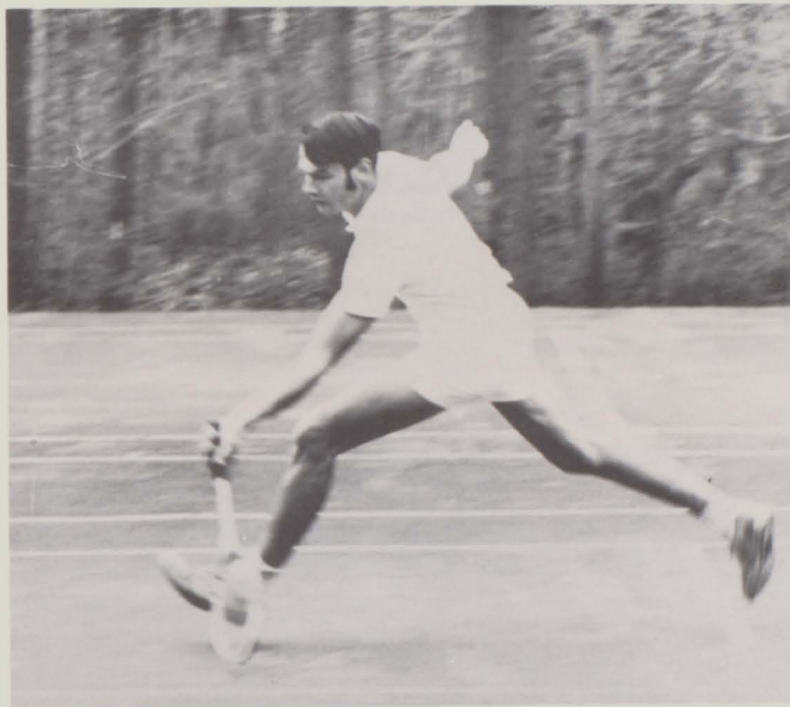
