# Boar's Head

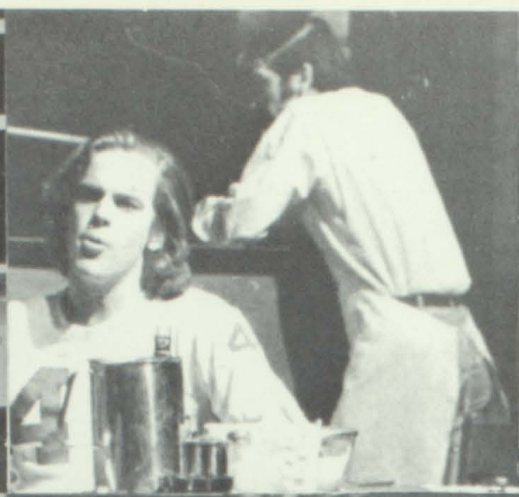

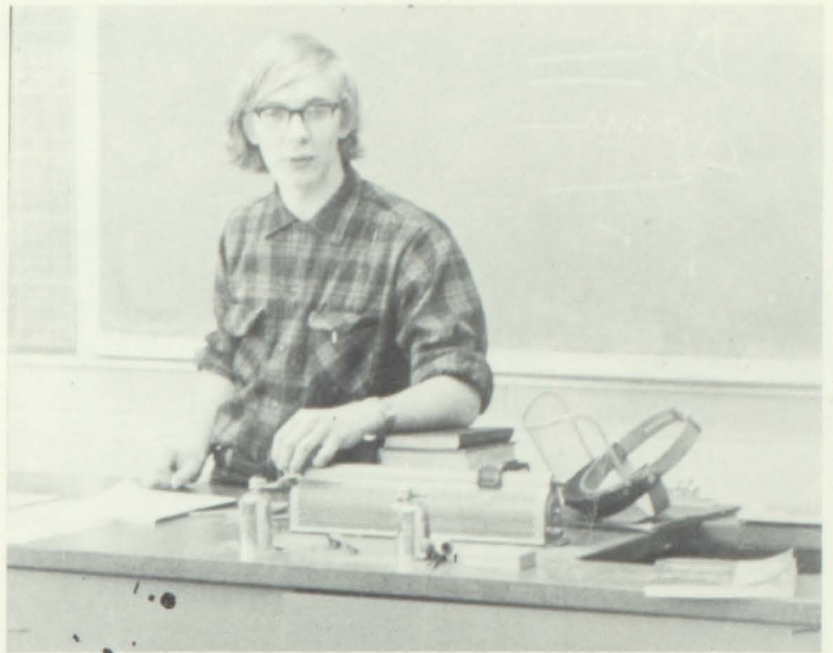

# Project Week

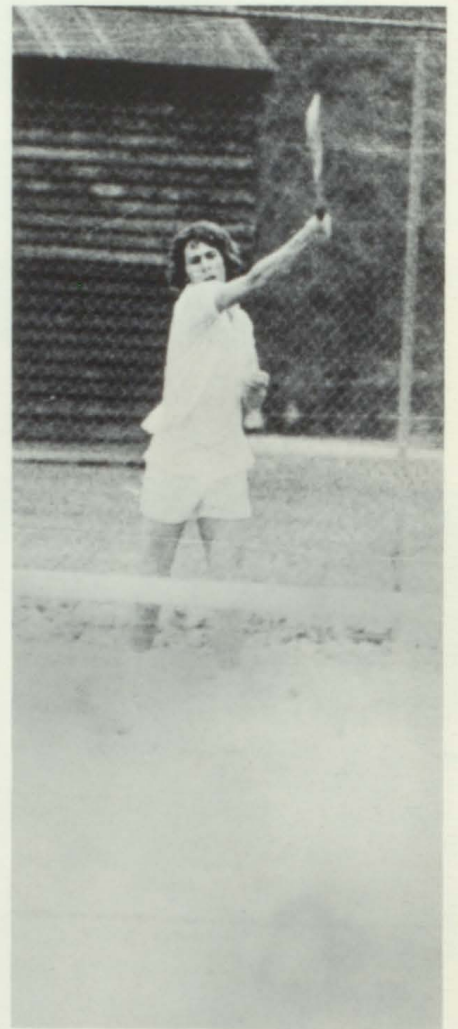
